Mayor Stephanie Almagno, Council Member Erik Keith, Council Member Theron Ayers, and Council Member Alice Venter were in attendance.

Call Meeting to Order

Mayor Stephanie Almagno called the meeting to order at 6:33 pm.

Invocation and Pledge

Consent Agenda

- a. Approval of Minutes: Council Meeting 11/13/2023 and Council Retreat 11/16/23 and 11/17/23.
- b. PD Budgeted Axon In-Car Cameras Purchase: \$14,975.92

Action: A motion was made by Theron Ayers to approve the council meeting minutes as presented with a second by Alice Venter. Motion Carried 3-0.

Action: A motion was made by Alice Venter to approve the Police Department Axon In-Car Cameras Purchase as presented with a second by Theron Ayers. Motion Carried 3-0.

Citizen Comments

Rose Basson of 734 Dawn Place addressed Council, first thanking Baldwin Police Department for their regular patrols and the streetlights placed at Highland Pointe. Basson said that several of her neighbors wanted to know about the timeline for the topcoat for the repaved street, and if the potholes can be addressed.

Basson also requested that speed bumps be placed at Highland Pointe to discourage speeding, as there are several blind turns and children play in the street. She also brought to Council's attention that the stop sign and street sign and at Dawn Place and Highland Pointe were taken down for construction and had not yet been replaced.

Fire Department – Chief Joe Roy

Chief Roy was not present due to a house fire and his report will be rescheduled for a future meeting.

Old Business

 Consideration/Approval of 2nd Reading of Precision Digital SUP Ordinance #2023-10132Z

Council had no further questions or concerns regarding this ordinance. Mayor Almagno read the highlighted portion of the ordinance.

Action: A motion was made by Alice Venter to approve the 2nd Reading of Precision Digital Special Use Permit Ordinance #2023-10132Z as presented with a second by Erik Keith. Motion Did Not Pass: 2-1 (Yes: Alice Venter, Erik Keith; No: Theron Ayers).

After the vote, Ayers clarified that he was mistaken on his vote and wanted to vote in the affirmative. The decision was made to table the ordinance until the next meeting to ensure Council had time to review the ordinance and vote accordingly.

Action: A motion was made by Alice Venter to table the adoption of Precision Digital SUP Ordinance #2023-10132Z to the December 11th council meeting with a second by Erik Keith. Motion Carried 3-0.

2. Consideration/Approval of 1st Reading of Wrecker Service Ordinance #2023-11135

Police Chief Chris Jones summarized the meeting held with the three wrecker companies on Baldwin's rotation and the changes made to the proposed policy. The maximum price rates have been updated from 2009 and created a heavy/commercial vehicle wrecker rotation for Ramey's and Hulsey's, instead of using the County's rotation list.

Liability coverage was increased, and garage keeper's insurance was added (previously not contemplated). The ordinance is written to allow a 10-mile radius for storage yards, which includes the current wrecker companies and any newcoming companies in the future.

Another change made to the policy to reduce cancellations once the towing company is enroute is a five-minute window to cancel once the call is made from dispatch. After five minutes the tow will not be cancelled, and the owner of the vehicle will settle a price with the tow company. If they cannot agree a price to settle, it is at the on-scene officer's discretion whether or not to tow the vehicle.

Mayor Almagno read the highlighted portion of the ordinance.

Action: A motion was made by Alice Venter to approve the 1st Reading of Wrecker Service Ordinance #2023-11135 as presented with a second by Erik Keith. Motion Carried 3-0.

Fire Chief Joe Roy arrived at the meeting at 7:00 pm and Council asked him to present his report as planned for this meeting.

Chief Roy gave a six-month report on call volume, types of calls, training completed, equipment obtained, and events conducted (see attached).

New Business

 Consideration/Approval of 1st Reading of Bellamy Zoning Ordinance #2023-11134Z

CAO Emily Woodmaster presented a request for a zoning change from Jacob Bellamy of Bellamy Auto Repair. Bellamy was granted a zoning change request in 2018 for his auto shop to Neighborhood Commercial (NC). He has since acquired the parcel south of his business and is asking for that parcel to be rezoned from Single Family District (R2) to NC in order to physically extend his building.

Mayor Almagno read the highlighted portion of the ordinance.

Action: A motion was made by Theron Ayers to approve the 1st Reading of Bellamy Zoning Ordinance #2023-11134Z as presented with a second by Alice Venter. Motion Carried 3-0.

4. Consideration/Approval of Awards Program Policy

Woodmaster addressed the Council regarding adding an Employee Awards policy to recognize and encourage employees as they dedicate their years of service to the City of Baldwin. Woodmaster stated that she wanted to create a policy in the handbook that will continue for years, and our employees can look forward to awards and recognition for their work. Woodmaster reviewed the proposed policy additions and the different tiers of awards for different years of service.

Action: A motion was made by Alice Venter to approve the Awards Program Policy as presented with a second by Theron Ayers. Motion Carried 3-0.
